A Study of Nashville: **Exploring the City from Different Perspectives**



Tuition and Fees

We want you to spend your summer with us! That's why we cover the cost of tuition (\$3,500+) for all students accepted into the Lipscomb Summer Scholars program. A program fee to cover housing, meals, activities and textbooks is the only expense for Summer Scholars students and their families. A deposit reserves your place in the program. The remaining balance is due in May.

Submit your application.

Summer Scholars is open to rising high school seniors who have scored at least a 24 on the ACT or 1160 on the SAT (ERW+M). The application will open in January and close in May. **Space is limited, so make plans to apply early** and take the ACT or SAT prior to the application deadline.

Then, follow these steps:

- Submit your application online at lipscomb.edu/summer-scholars.
- 2. Submit your academic evaluation form, official SAT/ACT test scores and high school transcript.
- 3. Send your deposit. You can pay online or by check. The deposit is refundable until May 1.
- 4. Once the above items are complete, schedule your interview to be done over video chat or on campus.

All documents should be official (sent directly from high schools, testing services and recommenders). Items can be submitted electronically or mailed to Lipscomb University.
